Magnus Lindelow is an economist in the Human Development Sector Unit in the East Asia and Pacific Department of the World Bank. He holds a doctorate in Economics from Oxford University. Prior to joining the World Bank, Magnus Lindelow worked as an economist in the Ministry of Planning and Finance in the Mozambique, and as a consultant on public expenditure and health sector issues in developing countries. Magnus Lindelow is involved in the design and management of health projects in China and is a contributing author to an ongoing World Bank study of China's rural health sector.
