A monthly series of dialogues with Bob Schieffer hosting top public-policy makers and journalists at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) headquarters at 1800 K Street, NW in Washington, DC. Most programs are scheduled in the late afternoon and include question-and-answer opportunities.

### Bob Schieffer



Bob Schieffer is broadcast journalism's most experienced Washington reporter. He is the CBS network's chief Washington correspondent and also serves as anchor and moderator of *Face The Nation*, CBS News' Sunday public affairs broadcast.

Schieffer has covered Washington for CBS News for more than 30 years and is one of the few broadcast or print journalists to have covered all four major beats in the nation's capital—the White House, the Pentagon, the State Department, and Capitol Hill. He has been chief Washington correspondent since 1982 and congressional correspondent since 1989. He has covered every presidential campaign and been a floor reporter at all of the Democratic and Republican National Conventions since 1972. He began anchoring *Face The Nation* in May 1991.

He has been a principal anchor for CBS News since 1973, when he was named anchor of the Sunday night edition of the *CBS Evening News*.

Schieffer joined CBS News in 1969 and, after a brief stint as a general assignment reporter, was named Pentagon correspondent, a post he held for four years.

Before joining CBS News, he was a reporter at the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* and, in 1965, became the first reporter from a Texas newspaper to report from Vietnam. Schieffer later became news anchor at WBAP-TV Dallas/Fort Worth, a post that eventually led to his joining CBS News.

He is a graduate of TCU in Fort Worth.

## Status of the North Korean Six-Party Talks

#### Joseph DeTrani



As North Korea mission manager for the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI), DeTrani is responsible for integrating collection and analysis on North Korea across the intelligence community, identifying and filling gaps in intelligence, and planning and ensuring the implementation of strategies. Most recently, he served as special envoy for the Six-Party Talks, with the rank of ambassador. Before joining the Department of State he served as a U.S. Air Force officer, worked in the private sector as an economist, and then joined the CIA as an economic analyst. At the CIA he served as executive assistant to the director of Central Intelligence and as director of European Operations, Technical Services, Public Affairs, the Crime and Narcotics Center, and East Asia Operations.

#### Robert Einhorn



Robert Einhorn is a senior adviser in the CSIS International Security Program, where he works on a broad range of nonproliferation, arms control, and other national security issues. Before joining CSIS, he served in the U.S. government for 29 years. From November 1999 to August 2001, he was assistant secretary for nonproliferation at the Department of State, where he was responsible for nonproliferation of nuclear, chemical, and biological weapons, missile delivery systems, and advanced conventional arms. Einhorn was deputy assistant secretary for nonproliferation in the State Department's Political-Military Bureau from 1992 to 1999 and a senior adviser on the department's Policy Planning Staff from 1986 to 1992.

#### Michael Green



Michael Green is a senior adviser and holds the Japan Chair at CSIS, as well as being an associate professor of international relations at Georgetown University. He served as special assistant to the president for national security affairs and senior director for Asian affairs at the National Security Council (NSC) from January 2004 to December 2005. He joined the NSC in April 2001 as director of Asian affairs with responsibility for Japan, Korea, and Australia/New Zealand. From 1997 to 2000, he was senior fellow for Asian security at the Council on Foreign Relations, where he directed the Independent Task Force on Korea. He served as senior adviser in the Office of Asian and Pacific Affairs at the Department of Defense in 1997 and as consultant to the same office until 2000.

#### David Sanger



David Sanger is chief Washington correspondent for the *New York Times* and is one of the newspaper's senior writers. In a 25-year career at the paper, he has reported from New York, Tokyo, and Washington, covering a variety of issues. He was a member of the *Times* reporting teams that won the Pulitzer Prize for coverage of the Challenger space shuttle disaster and of the Clinton administration's struggle to control exports to China. Sanger is currently on book leave from the *Times*, working on his forthcoming book, *The Inheritance: The World America Now Faces*. It will be published in January 2009.
