Advisory Board, Panel & Speaker Biographies

(Arranged alphabetically)

Ali Alatas was formerly the Minister of Foreign Affairs for Indonesia from 1988-1998 and Special Envoy of the United Nations to negotiate with the Government of Burma for the release of Aung San Suu Kyi. He is currently a member of the President's Council of Advisors and Chairman for International Relations Affairs.

Honorable Sofyan A. Djailil previously served as Indonesia's State Minister for Information and Communication and as an expert staff member at the Ministry of Justice. Additionally, he also served as a commissioner with several enterprises, including PT Pelindo III and PT PLN. He received his doctorate in law and diplomacy from Tufts University. Currently, he serves as Indonesia's Minister for State-Owned Enterprises.

Ronald Goldstock was formerly the Assistant District Attorney for New York County (1969-75), Deputy Inspector General, U.S. Department of Labor, (1979- 80), and Managing Director of Kroll Associates (1995). He received his A.B. in 1966 from Cornell University and his J.D. in 1969 from Harvard University School of Law. He currently serves on the Academic Council of the CSIS Hills Program on Governance and is an Adjunct Professor at Cornell University and New York University School's of Law. He is the author of the article "The Prosecutor as Problem Solver" (1991) and co-author of the book, *Official Corruption: A Simulated Investigation. Teacher's Guide and Background Materials* (1977).

Emmy Hafild formerly served as Secretary General of Transparency International (Indonesia) and Director of WALHI-Friends of the Earth Indonesia. She studied agronomy at Bogor Agriculture Institute and was granted a Fulbright Scholarship to obtain her MSc. in Environmental Studies from the University of Wisconsin. Currently she is the Chief of Cluster, Economic and Environment Governance at the Partnership for Governance Reform in Indonesia.

Ambassador Han Sung-Joo formerly served as South Korean Minister of Foreign Affairs (1993-94), Ambassador of South Korea to the United States (2003-05), and Director of the Ilmin International Relations Institute at Korea University (1995-2002). Ambassador Han is a graduate of Seoul National University and received a Ph.D. in political science from the University of California, Berkeley. Currently he is Chairman of the Asian Institute for Policy Studies.

Erry Riyana Hardjapamekas (Chairman, Advisory Board) was formerly Vice Chairman of the Corruption Eradication Commission of the Republic of Indonesia and President Commissioner of the Jakarta Stock Exchange from 1998-2001. He is currently President Commissioner of Bank BNI.

Ambassador Carla A. Hills formerly served as U.S. Trade Representative (1989 to 1993), Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, and Assistant Attorney General of the Civil Division at the U.S. Department of Justice. She received her B.A. from Stanford University, J.D. from Yale University, and has studied at Oxford University. She is currently a Co-Chairman at the Council on Foreign Relations, Chair of the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, and Chairman and CEO of Hills & Company, International Consultants. In addition, she is also a Cofounder of the CSIS Hills Program on Governance.

Roderick M. Hills formerly served as Counsel to President Gerald R. Ford, Chairman of the Securities & Exchange Commission (1975-1977), and Law Clerk to the United States Supreme Court (1955-1957). He was a Founder, former Chairman, and is currently the Vice-chairman of the US-ASEAN Business Council and has been a Visiting Professor at the Schools of Law and Business of

Harvard University, a Distinguished Faculty Fellow at the Yale School of Organization and Management and a lecturer at the School of Law of Stanford University. He received his B.A. from Stanford University and J.D. from Stanford University's School of Law. He is currently a partner with Hills Stern & Morley LLP, and is a Cofounder and Chairman of the CSIS Hills Program on Governance.

Hu Angang is a Professor of Economics at Tsinghua University, and Director of the Center for China Studies at the Chinese Academy of Sciences. He also serves as Chief Editor for the China Studies Report, a reference journal circulated for senior Chinese leaders. His research focuses on Chinese political economy and development policies. He has written numerous books and some of his representative works include: "China Toward the 21st Century", "The Political Economy of Uneven Development: The Case of China", and "Economic and Social Transformation in China." He received a Ph.D. from the Chinese Academy of Sciences and did his post-doctoral studies at Yale University.

Ambassador Cameron R. Hume presented his credentials as U.S. Ambassador to Indonesia on August 1, 2007. He is a member of the Foreign Service with the rank of Career Minister. His earlier assignments included Italy, Tunisia, Syria, Lebanon, the United Nations, and the Holy See. More recently he has served as Ambassador to Algeria and to South Africa, and as Chargé d'Affaires to Sudan. He is a lawyer and admitted to practice in New York and the District of Columbia. His foreign languages include Arabic, French, and Italian.

Gerald F. Hyman formerly served as Director of the Office of Democracy and Governance at the U.S. Agency for International Development (2002-2007). He received a B.A. in philosophy and Ph.D. in anthropology from the University of Chicago and a J.D. from the University of Virginia. He is currently President of the CSIS Hills Program on Governance and serves on the Advisory Council to the Center for International Media Assistance of the National Endowment for Democracy.

Jaung Hoon previously served as a key member of the Task Force on the Reform of the Presidency organized by the East Asia Institute (EAI) to redefine the role of the presidency (2002–2003) and as coordinator of the EAI Task Force on the Reform of the Electoral System, Political Parties, and the National Assembly (2003–2004). He is the author of the chapter "Electoral Politics and Political Parties" in *Institutional Reform*. He is currently a Professor of Political Science at Chung-Ang University (Seoul) and was Editor-in-Chief of the *Korean International Studies Review*.

Michael Johnston serves on the Academic Council of the CSIS Hills Program on Governance and is Professor of Political Science and Division Director for the Social Sciences at Colgate University. Of his numerous publications, he is the author of the book *Syndromes of Corruption: Wealth, Power, and Democracy* (2005) and *Political Corruption: Concepts and Contexts* (2002), and editor of the book *Civil Society and Corruption: Mobilizing for Reform* (2005). He received his B.A. from Macalester College (USA), and M.Phil. and Ph.D. from Yale University.

Kim Joongi serves on the Advisory Board of the CSIS Hills Program on Governance, and is Associate Dean (Office of International Affairs) and Professor of Law at the College of Law, Yonsei University. He was also a Visiting Associate Professor at the National University of Singapore and Assistant Professor of Law and Business Administration at Hongik University. He is the author of the forthcoming publications "Institutionalizing Undue Influence: The Case of Samsung in Korea" (2009) and "The Formation of Rule of Law in Corporate Governance" (2008). He received his B.A. from Columbia College, M.A. from Yonsei University, and J.D. from Georgetown University.

Kim Junki previously served as a member of the Presidential Commission on Policy Planning, Evaluation Committee for State-Owned Enterprises and the Advisory Committee for Ministry of

Planning and Budget. He received a B.A. in Economics from the London School of Business and Ph.D. in Public Policy from Harvard University. He is the author of “Non-governmental Organizational Governance and Corporate Governance: A Comparative Analysis” (2007) and “Governance, Organizational Effectiveness, and the Nonprofit Sector: The Case of Korea” (2004). Currently he is the Director of the Telecommunications Research Center and Professor in the Graduate School of Public Administration at Seoul National University.

Noke Kiroyan has headed several companies in Indonesia, including PT Newmont Pacific Nusantara and Rio Tinto, and has held senior management positions for firms in Germany and Australia. He is currently President Director and Founder of Kiroyan Kuhon Partners, which advises investors, particular foreign investors, on general business strategies in Indonesia. In addition, he provides advice on corporate social responsibility, public affairs, and communications.

Stein Kristiansen was formerly an Associate Professor in the Development Studies Program at Agder University College. He has received degrees from the Universities of Oslo (1979), Bergen (1982), and Norwegian School of Economics and Business Administration (1985 and 1988). Currently he is a Professor in the Department of Economics at the University of Agder (Norway) and Visiting Professor in Magister Asministrasi Publik at Gadjah Mada University (Indonesia).

Ari Kuncoro is a Senior Research Associate in the Institute of Economic and Social Research at the University of Indonesia and has been the principal investigator on economics and governance in Indonesia since 2001. He has expertise in applied microeconomics, industrial economics and economic development. He received his Ph.D. in economics from Brown University and is the author of the publications, “Corruption and Business Uncertainty in Indonesia” (2006) and “Corruption in Indonesia” (2006).

Ipung Kurnia has been President Director of PT Hero Supermarket Tbk since 1992. He earned a B.A. in Marketing from Simon Fraser University (Canada) and an MBA from City University (Canada).

Li Cheng is a Senior Fellow in the John L. Thornton China Center at the Brookings Institution (Washington, D.C.) and the William R. Kenan Professor of Government at Hamilton College in New York. In 1997, he published the nationally acclaimed book, *Rediscovering China: Dynamics and Dilemmas of Reform*. He received an M.A. in Asian Studies from the University of California, Berkeley and a Ph.D. in Political Science at Princeton University.

Todung Mulya Lubis practices law and is one of the most prominent NGO activists in Indonesia. He is Chairman of the Executive Board of Transparency International (Indonesia) and the Indonesian International Crisis Group, Member of the Board of Trustees of the Indonesian Legal Aid Foundation, Head of the Ethical Board of the Indonesian Corruption Watch, and Member of the Board of Trustees of the Center for Electoral Reform.

Nono Anwar Makarim was formerly a member of Indonesia’s Parliament (1967-1971) and has been legal advisor to the Government of Indonesia, including to the Minister of Trade and Industry for the Doha Round of multilateral negotiations and the Uruguay round of trade negotiations. He is Founding Partner of Makarim & Taira S., one of the most prominent finance law firms in Indonesia, and received his Ph.D. in law from Harvard University.

Peter Meyer is the senior country officer of the American International Group, Inc (AIG) in Indonesia. He moved to his current posting in 1987, following more than 10 years of general and regional line management assignments throughout Southeast Asia and the Far East. He served in various capacities with the Insurance Counsel of Indonesia, is an advisor to the board of the

Indonesian Life Insurance Association (AAJI) and is a long standing Board of Governors' Member of AMCHAM Indonesia, where he also chairs the Chamber's Services Committee. He joined AIG in 1970 and has worked in the insurance industry for well over 40 years.

Emil Salim was formerly the Vice Chairman of Bappenas, Minister of State for the Improvement of the State Apparatus (1973-1978), Minister of Communication (1973-1978), Minister of State for Development Supervision Population and the Environment (1978-1983), and Minister of State for Population and the Environment 1983-1993). Presently he is a member of the President's Council of Advisors and Indonesian Academy of Sciences.

Arifin Siregar was formerly Trade Minister for Indonesia in the 1990's, Governor of Bank Indonesia, and Indonesian Ambassador to the United States. He also served with the International Monetary Fund from 1965-1971. He is currently a Co-chairman of the Governing Board of the Indonesian Council on World Affairs and Co-chairman of the US-Indonesia Society (USINDO).

Natalia Soebagjo is Chair of the OC of the Bung Hatta Anti-corruption Award Committee.

Gumilar Rusliwa Somantri is the Rektor of the University of Indonesia and Professor of Urban Sociology. Appointed as the Dean of the Faculty of Social and Political Studies at the University of Indonesia (2002-2006 and 2006-210), he received his Ph.D. in urban sociology from the University of Bielefeld (Germany) in 1995. He is the author of numerous books and has conducted collaborative research projects. He is a visiting research fellow to leading universities and research institutes in Europe, United States, and Japan. His main academic interests include globalization, urbanization, and poverty alleviation in Southeast Asia.

Honorable Sri Mulyani Indrawati previously served as Governor for Indonesia for the Asian Development Bank, Executive Director of the International Monetary Fund for Southeast Asia, and Indonesia's Minister of State for National Development Planning. She holds a doctoral degree and a master's degree in economics from the University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign. Currently, she is Indonesia's Minister of Finance.

Kemal A. Stamboel is Vice President and Member of Council Board of deTIKNas (the Information Technology and National Communication Council).

Arief Surowidjojo has previously served as Chair of the Board of Trustees of Transparency International (Indonesia). He received his J.D. from the University of Washington and is currently a Senior Partner at Lubis, Ganie & Surowidjojo and Senior Lecturer at the Faculty of Law at University of Indonesia.

William Wallace was formerly Chief or Deputy Chief of Party for the highly regarded Indonesian Development Studies Project (DSP) and Indonesian Partnership for Economic Growth (PEG) projects. He holds a PhD from Boston University. Currently he is the lead economist in the World Bank office in Indonesia.

Gita Wirjawan previously worked with Goldman Sachs. Currently he is both an investment banker and Senior Country Officer and President Director of JPMorgan Chase Bank in Indonesia.

Yu Keping is Professor and Director of the China Center for Comparative Politics and Economics (CCCPE), and Professor and Director at the Center for Chinese Government Innovations at Peking University. He also serves as Deputy Director of the Bureau of Translation of the CCP Central Committee. Some of his published works include "The Institutional Environment of Civil Society in

China” (2006), “Chinese Rural Governance in the Past and Present” (2004), and “The Emergence of Civil Society and Its Significance for Governance” (2002).
